

OUR INSTITUTION

Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose Memorial (NSCBM) Government College, Hamirpur stands as a beacon of academic excellence, innovation, and holistic development in Himachal Pradesh. Established in 1965, the college has successfully entered its sixth decade, evolving from a modest undergraduate institution into one of the premier centers of higher learning in the state. Nestled amidst the serene Dhauladhar ranges, the campus spans over 22 acres and offers an inspiring environment for intellectual growth and personal transformation.

In a historic achievement in 2024, the college has secured 1st position in the State Institution Ranking Framework (SIRF) out of 141 colleges across Himachal Pradesh. This top-ranking status, earned with an exceptional score of 1019 out of 1100, affirms our unwavering dedication to quality education, optimal resource utilization, student-centric innovation. The SIRF assessment, conducted for the first time in the state, evaluated institutions on seven key parameters. Self Financing Courses Under Higher Education Institute Society

School of Business Administration

Bachelor of Business Administration (B.B.A.), Bachelor of Computer Application (B.C.A.) & Post Graduate Diploma in Computer Application (PGDCA) are being run by the College under self-financing Scheme by Higher Education Institute Society.

Bachelor of Business Administration (B.B.A.) programme was introduced by the Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla in the University College of Business Studies with the objectives of training and meeting man power requirements for junior management positions.

On the same pattern we are offering the programmeatyour doorstep.

The duration of B.B.A. is three years, spread over six semesters. There shall be an examination at the end of each semester.

The total number of seats in B.B.A. course is 100, distributed as under. Subsidised candidates: 60 seats Non-Subsidised seats 40

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION TO BBA

Plus two examination under 10+2 system or examination by law in India there to of a Board/ University established by law in India with 45% marks (40% marks for scheduled caste/Scheduled tribes)

OR

Any examination of a university/Board/college or school in a foreign country recognized as equivalent for above purpose by the Vice-Chancellor/ Equivalent committee of its own or on recommendations of association of Indian Universities with 45% marks (40% marks in case of SC/ST.)

AGE LIMIT

Except for NRI's/NRI sponsored/Foreign Candidates the maximum age limit for the course in 22 years on the 1st July of the year concerned, provided that in case of Candidates belonging to SC/ST, The Upper age limit will be relaxed by 3 years. Provided further that the Vice-

Chancellor shall have the power to permit age relaxation for reason to be recorded in writing to a maximum of three months reasons to be recorded in writing, up to maximum period of three months

BASIS OF ADMISSION

There shall be an admission test for candidates seeking admission to B.B.A. Course. Admission to BBA comprises of four stages i.e., Application Rating, Written Test (consisting of General English, General Mathematics, General Knowledge and General Management) & Interview. The entrance test of one and half hour duration shall consist of one paper of 70 marks (70 questions of 1 mark each).

1. Application Rating

30 Marks (15 marks each for Matric & +2 examination level on the basis of percentage scored in the examination. While computing merit a candidate having commerce or mathematics as a subject at +2 level) will be given additional weightage of 10% of aggregate marks obtained him/her in +2 examination.

- Separate merits lists shall be prepared for subsidised category and NRI's/NRI sponsored/Foreign National (Self Financing Category) The NRI/NRI-Sp/FN shall complete amongst their own category.
- 2. The college reserves the right to fil any vacant seat(s) in the self-financing category (i.e. NRI's/NRI Sponsored/Foreign Nationals) on the basis of academic performance of the candidate in the past examinations, merit will be computed on the basis of Matric and 10+2 or equivalent examinations having equal weightage, whereas candidates having Commerce or Mathematics as a subject at +2 level will be given additional weightage of 10% of aggregate marks obtained by him/her in 10+2 or equivalent examination. Only eligible candidates depending upon the number of seats are admitted to the programme.

SEATS, ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS AND BASIS OF ADMISSION

BCA is the three year Degree Course split in six semesters. There will be mid-term and end-term exams in each semester. The total number of seats in BCA course is 40. The distribution of Seats is as under:

ELIGIBILITY TO ADMISSION IN BCA

Plus two examinations under 10+2 system or examination equivalent thereto, of a Board/University established by law in India with at least 40% marks (35% marks for scheduled caste/Scheduled tribes).

OR

Any examination of a university/Board/college or schoolin a foreign country recognized as equivalent for above purpose of eligibility as laid down by the Vice-Chancellor / Equivalent committee of its own or on recommendations of association of Indian Universities with 40% marks (35% marks in case of SC/ST).

AGE LIMIT

Except for NRI's/NRI sponsored/Foreign candidates, the maximum age limit for the course is 21 years male candidates of General Category and 23 years for female candidates of General Category and 24 years for both male and female SC/ST category as on the 1st July of the year concerned. The Vice-Chancellor may permit age relaxation up to maximum of three months.

BASIS OF ADMISSION

SCHEME-I (Subsidised Seats)

There shall be entrance examination admission test for candidates seeking admission to BCA Course. The selection process comprise of two stages viz., written test of 70 marks and Academic weightage of 30 marks. The Merit will be drawn out of 100 marks. The entrance test of one & half hour shall consist of one paper of 70 marks.

SCHEME-II (NON-SUBSIDIZED SEATS)

The scheme admits students as per the merit in entrance examination after filling in seats in subsidized category.

In addition to the eligibility conditions mentioned above (under Scheme I), NRI's/NRI Sponsored/ Foreign nationals shall be required to submit along with the application form, any one of the following documents as may be applicable for category of their candidature.

- a) Proof of Nationality in case of Foreign Nationals.
- b) Proof of their status in the case of NRI's. For this purpose, either of the following documents shall be considered as a proof:
 - Copy of Non resident card/Employment card issued by the employer.
 - Photocopy of the Immigration card/ employment VISA entry on the passport along with details of the passport.
 - Certificate issued by the Indian Embassy/High Commission in the country where NRI is residing.
- c) Certificate of sponsorship from NRI in the case of a sponsored candidate, along with proof of NRI status of the sponsorer required under para (B).
- d) Photocopy of the latest assessment order of the Income-tax authorize in India and the Permanent Account Number (PAN) of the sponsorer issued by the Income Tax Department.

A Bachelor's Degree in any discipline with a minimum of 48 credits in Major subject, 48 credits in two minor subjects, 09 credits in compulsory, 01 credit GI & hobby with aggregate of 106 credits for the award of pass degree.

OF

A Bachelor's (Hons.) Degree in any discipline with a minimum of 56 credits in Major subject, 40 credits in two minor subject, 09 credits in compulsory, 01 credit GI & hobby and 14 credits in additional/compulsory/skill-based and 03 credit in GI & hobby) with aggregate of 120 credits for the award of Honours degree.

OR

At least 50% marks in aggregate (45% in case of SC/ST from a University established by Law in India).

AGELIMIT

The maximum age limit for the candidate seeking admission to PGDCA programme shall be 26 years for male candidates, 28 years for female candidates and 29 years for SC/ST candidates as on 1st July of the admission year.

BASICS OF ADMISSION

The admission to the course will be made strictly on the basis of marks obtained in the entrance test subject to the reservations approved by the H.P.U. Shimla. The merit will be determined on the basis of written examination to be conducted by the NSCBM Govt. College, Hamirpur, Himachal Pradesh. The entrance test of one hour duration shall consist of one paper of 100 marks (50 questions each of two marks) as detailed below:

GENERAL CONDUCT/DISCIPLINE RULES

- Use of mobile phones by the students in and around the classroom(s) and Exam. Hall(s) is strictly prohibited.

IMPORTANT:

- Stringent action will be taken against student found guilty of breaching conduct or discipline rules in the college, by the college administration.
- Defaulters including students whose name has been struck off the roll(s) are not allowed to enter the college premises until exonerated or readmitted appropriately.

1. ATTENDANCE

- At least 75% lecture attendance is compulsory for appearing in the university exam.
- ii) An irregular students or one who remains absent

continuously for 7 days from College/any elective subject, his/her name will be struck-off from the college rolls. If name of a student is struck-off twice, he/she will not be re-admitted to the college.

- iii) A student is liable to pay all dues & fines as long as his/her name remains on the college rolls.
- iv) The principal reserves the right of expulsion/ suspension of any student if the situation warrants so.

2. LEAVERULES

- Application for any kind of leave on the prescribed performs should be submitted well in time.
- Leave upto three days will be sanctioned by the tutor. For a grant of leave for single period the concerned subject teacher is competent.
- iii) Leave for three days up to six days will be sanctioned by senior tutor. Leave for more than six days will be sanctioned by the principal on the simultaneous recommendation of concerned subject teacher and senior tutor.
- iv) In case of medical leave for a period of over six days the applicant must produce a medical certificate.

IMPORTANT: Student participating in inter-college competitions should note that the practical/rehearsal timing should be either before the classes (early morning) or after the classes (evening) because all such activities do not substitute

3. LIBRARY RULE

Every student will be issued an identity card. Since "lcard" is the only medium to identify/differentiate a bonafide college student from an outsider, every student must always carry it with him/her and must produce it whenever required (during all working days, examination (s) and college function(s) etc. Otherwise he/she will be considered an outsider and will be punished accordingly.

An inter faculty cultural function is held in the month of Dec. for students to represent their faculties for running trophy in various activities based on the format of HP University Youth Festival.

NSS, NCC, ROVERS & RANGER

AND RED CROSS SOCIETY

To inculcate the qualities of leadership, social service, discipline and patriotism among the youth following units are being run in the college.

NSS Presently the college has there NSS Unit comprising 100 students each. In each unit 33% seats are reserved for girls. The students who attend 240 hours of social service and attend "7 days" special camp are given a special benefit of 2% marks at the time of admission to the H.P. University P.H. Courses, NCC At present the college has two wings of NCC, one
